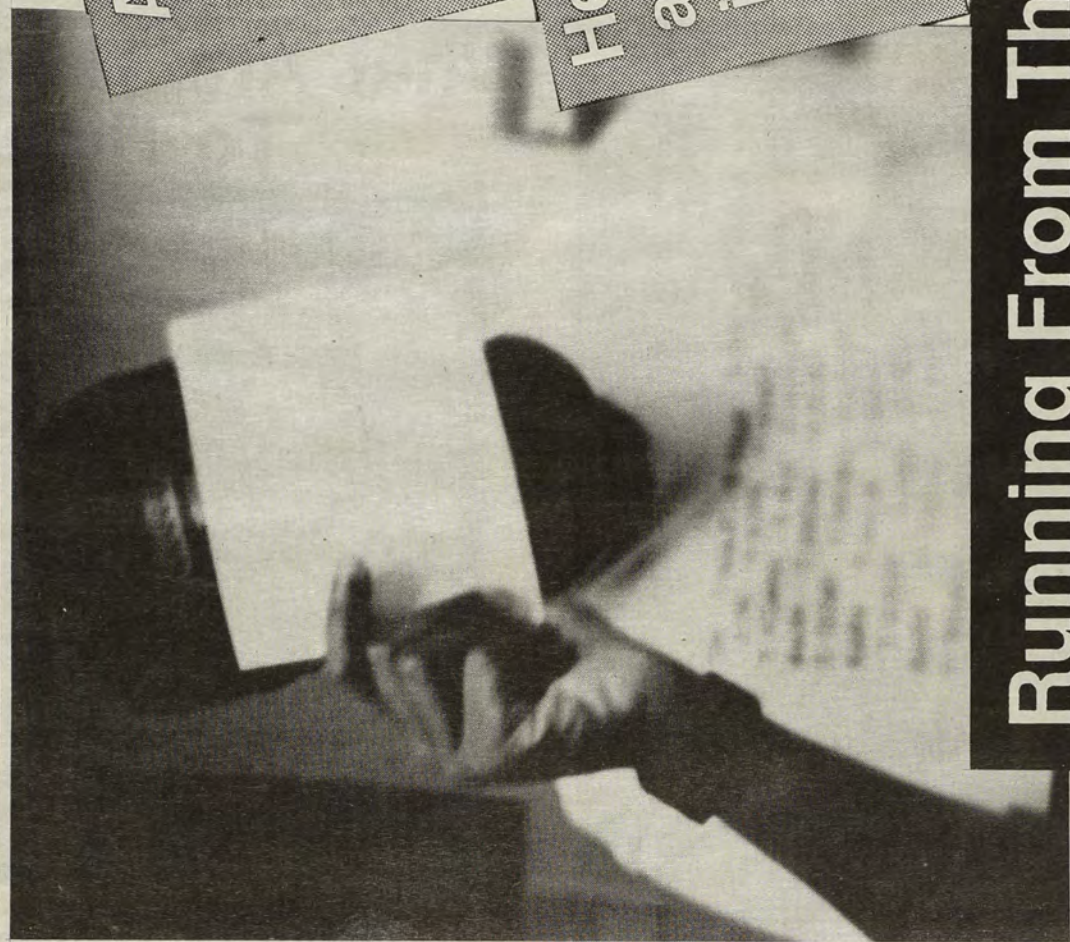

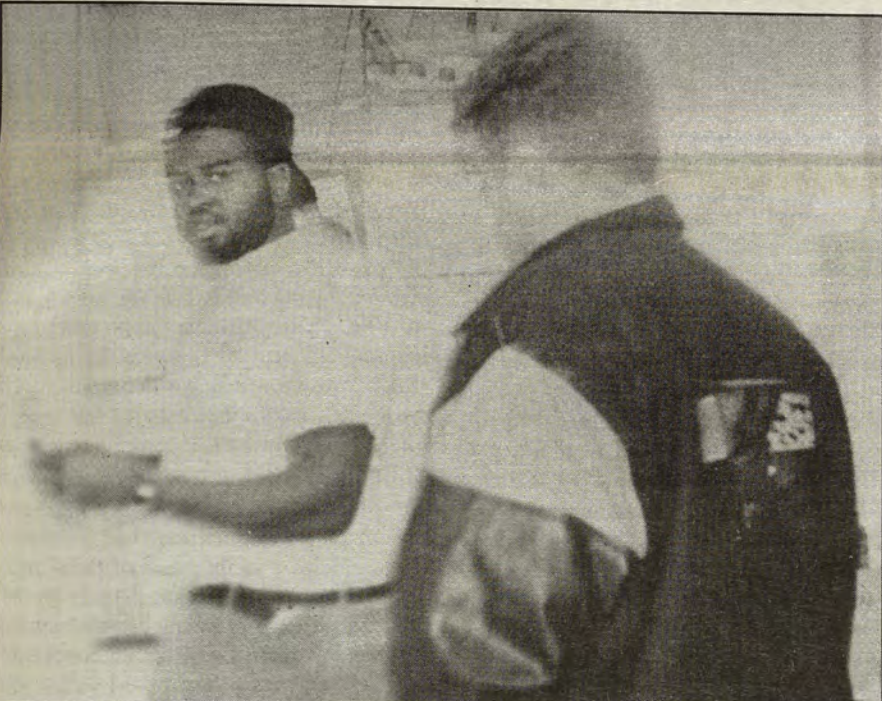


Mobster "Spineless" Gym Bayberry hiding out at campus radio station!

In the face of new developments in the former Soviet Union, Our Eye College has decided to change the name of the "Student Union" to the "Commonwealth of Independent Students."

Innovative Bush Program Directs USA Toward Energy Independence!

In a staggering announcement that shook American international economic relations from Tokyo to the Persian Gulf, President George Bush announced a new "Energy Strategy," that will force the United States into energy independence by the year 2015. "This program, although painful at first, is necessary to insure the safety of the free world, as well as the only possible mechanism for American long-term economic stability" said Bush while announcing his program.

Bush spoke with total confidence. "We just went to war in the Middle East; what

omy seem like its growing (it feels high). Yet the American economic dependency that results devastates the economy by sapping its vital investment resources; without those investment resources, the economy will **not** be strong! Recessionary down cycles will be longer and more difficult with higher jobless rates. Economic upturns will be increasingly less profitable for both business and households.

The new Bush energy independence program focuses on money. Its strict goal is to turn the \$60 billion per year exported for oil to \$5 billion in ten years (by 2002). First, NASA, the American space agency (which receives a total of about \$7.5 billion in total funding per year) will officially change its name to the National Association Science Administration, and will adapt its programs to total scientific endeavors including some aspects of the space program but not all of them (the space station "Freedom" and its \$2.2 billion was totally cut).

Second, a transition program of energy independence that is designed to promote domestic sources of energy was put in place. Solar and wind power will generate etc., will be encouraged (by monetary incentives) to incorporate natural gas as a fossil fuel. Nuclear fission power will be given a "timetable of transition," where it will contribute to the transition period away from imported fuel, but eventually phased out.

Third, energy R&D responsibility will be given to the Pentagon with the understanding that American energy independence is priority one for national security. With this change (away from the Department of Energy), the Pentagon will be expected to finance Nuclear Fission (both cold and hot) R&D. The plan hopes to have acquired Nuclear Fusion energy for commercial use by the year 2015. Said Bush "We put a man on the moon in 10 years, let's incorporate cuts in "star wars," the space station "freedom," as well as PROJECT." Bush also intends to include a 50 cents a gallon tax on any gasoline manufactured from imported oil (commercial vehicles exempt), half of those proceeds will go to a domestic subsidy on the commercial use of methanol (manufactured from corn), which the program hopes will be available commercially for less than 60 cents per gallon.

could be a greater indication of an unstable area? It doesn't make sense that our nation's economic stability be founded from an area of such instability. To be a truly free nation, we must be able to sustain strong economic growth, without a foreign dependency of any kind. We must again become a producer nation, and to be a producer nation, American energy independence is the most determinate factor."

Indeed the president is correct! Energy is the determinant factor for American stability. On a macroeconomic scale, no manufacturing base can be founded in a country that spends vital investment money for its energy needs. The export of domestic dollars from the total money supply totaled over \$60 billion for energy in 1991, (slightly less than the total budget of the Pentagon) most of that \$60 billion accumulating in OPEC nation banks. That \$60 billion represents a cash depletion from the American money supply. The effect of a cash depletion is more devastating than any Japanese "trade imbalance" because it represents a removal of the investment source for business; the circulating value of investment money. Oil is economic cocaine. An abundance of it, at any price, makes the American econ-

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Squirrels Stampede!

Yesterday morning at precisely nine o'clock, a hostile flock of approximately 4,000 squirrels strategically stampeded the RIC campus, taking the lives of 12 college faculty members, students and other unidentified innocent bystanders.

Dining Center Is An Iraqi Chemical Weapons Plant

A large cache of secret government documents has been leaked to the *Canchor*. These reports confirmed that Dungeonland Dining Center is indeed an Iraqi chemical weapons plant.

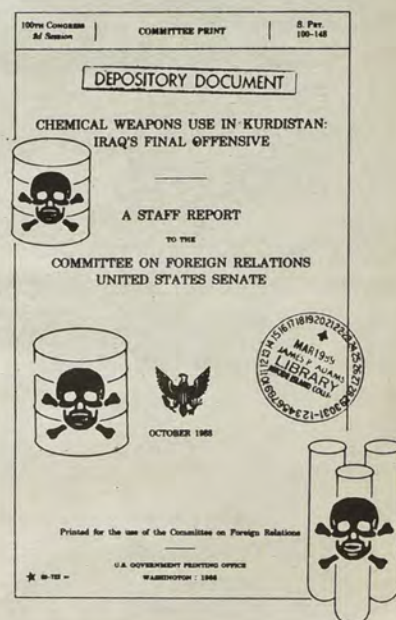
Initial investigations began in 1986, when the CIA caught wind of a certain "meatloaf incident." It was believed that the "ingredients" were in fact chemicals later refined as a gas weapon used in the Iran-Iraq War. The evidence was not solid enough for the U.S. Government to take action.

The staff report mentioned certain dining dishes such as a pasta dish, a salad oil, and a roast beef concoction as carrying crucial



elements used in producing mustard gas, nerve agents, tear gas, and vomiting agents.

Studies later proved there was enough thiodiglycerol in a weiner and fries lunch special to kill every living thing in a 100-square mile area. The coffee, when mixed with cream, produces phosgene gas and the Grey Poupon, well, isn't that kind of mustard.

The Bush Administration was outraged. The president of RIC, John Nosearium, was speechless as the reports went public, whereas the students were not surprised.

"Hey, we've been complaining about it for years!" commented one student. Iraqi ambassador Tariq Aziz could not be reached for comment.

New Walsh Gym to Open April 25

Soon Rhode Island College will once again have its own gym. On April 25, the \$20 million project will be dedicated in an afternoon ceremony, complete with Governor Bob Sunless as master of ceremonies. This event will mark the beginning of a new era at Rhode Island College, mainly because of the many opportunities that the new gym offers to athletes and the general public.

The money for this building has been donated by the Rhode Island Chapter of NCAA, which has the responsibility to rebuild all damaged and destroyed buildings within six months. If the necessary money cannot be raised within that amount of time, the Chapter must donate whatever amount is needed. Therefore, the Chapter has recently made a \$17.9 million donation to the college for the purpose of rebuilding Walsh Gym.

As for the building itself, one added bonus is the parking garage located on the upper level. According to sources in the Vehicle and Storage Relocation Agency, there will be "at least 500 parking spaces available in this garage," which consists of three levels. There is also a highly technical security system to be installed which will protect all cars parked in the garage 24 hours a day. Although this system is expensive, in the long run it will be cheaper than having to pay security guards hourly wages.

One of the major changes inside of the gym is the addition of two Olympic-size swimming pools, designated as future practice and meet sites of the newly organized RIC Swim Teams. Sources in the Interior Design Management Agency state that the two pools will be located on either end of the first floor. By arranging the pools in this way, the Agency will be able to maximize all available space.

Besides the two swimming pools, there will also be three weight rooms, one designed especially for male athletes and one for female athletes.

A new gymnasium will occupy roughly half of the remaining space on the first floor, according to the Interior Design Management Agency. This new gym will

serve as homecourt to the basketball teams, and as a home ice arena for the RIC hockey team. This will be the first time in school history that the hockey team will have a home arena in which to play their games. The arrangement of Boston Garden served as the basis for this idea.

This new gym will have approximately 12,500 seats, to satisfy the exceedingly large crowds that RIC sporting events always attract. The large seating capacity might also help to make RIC a more attractive place to hold events that require sufficient seating.

An indoor track and volleyball court will be put in the remaining space on this floor. The track will be approximately 1/8 of a mile, and the volleyball court will be built to official Olympic regulations.

On the second floor, there will be racquetball courts, an indoor spa and sauna and a lounge area, complete with color tv, VCR, and Nintendo. Also, located on the east wing of the second floor, there will be a day care center, highlighted by daily visits from Ronald McDonald, and a few of the Sesame Street characters.

The third floor will belong to the athletic department, which will have access to the entire floor. There will be an executive dining room, complete with a fully staffed kitchen and lounge area.

According to the Collegiate Fire Prevention Commission, the new Walsh building is 100% fire proof. Every floor will have a minimum of 5 fire alarms and smoke detectors. Also, sprinkler systems will be installed on every floor.

With all of the expensive equipment that will be stored in the new facility, college community members have expressed concern about possible vandalism and break-ins. Therefore, in addition to the security system, there will be a team of watchdog Doberman Pinschers stationed at each entrance of the building from 7pm-12 midnight every day.

Woodchuck Tired of Chucking Wood

World League Log Thrower Decides to Axe Contract

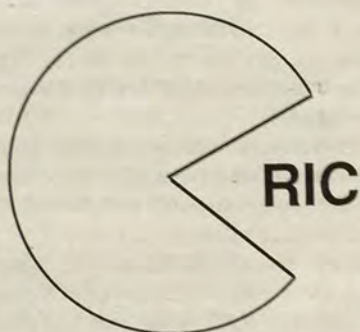
RIC Video Game To Be Released

Rumor states that local Pop Legend, "Tommy Gun," will be the opening act, singing his nursery-rhyme rock hits.



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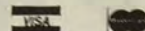

Parking Problem

Nearly every morning between 8 and 8:30 a.m. a traffic jam occurs from the RIC road along Mt. Pleasant Avenue up to Cathedral Avenue. At about 10 a.m. students coming for third period classes are unable to find parking spaces in the three assigned student parking lots.
