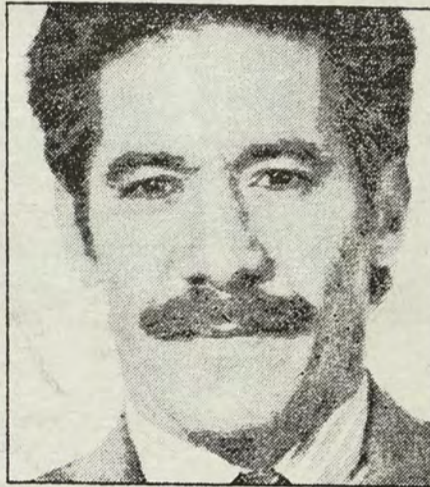

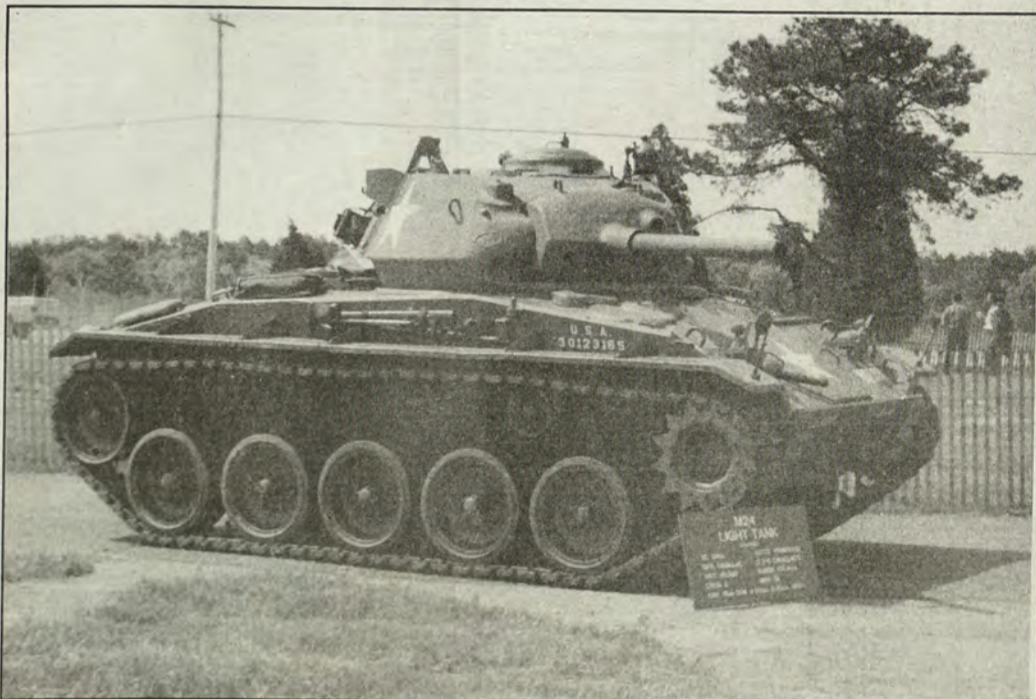

# CBS replaces NFC with RIC

In an unexpected move, CBS recently announced that they will begin to carry all RIC football games. The network, still reeling from the loss of the NFC to the Fox network have announced that they will be sending a crew to the campus to cover the RIC football games every Sunday.

The reaction around campus was mixed, star running back Ludwig 'Crash' Corrigan said that "...this is really what we need, I need the exposure if I want to be a top draft pick in next years draft." This feeling was shared by the quarterback. 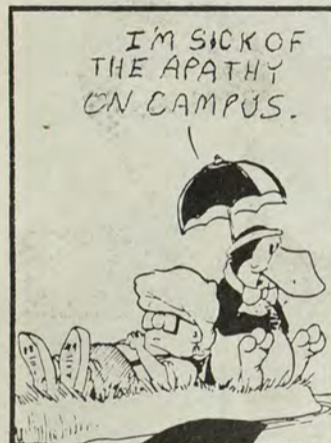

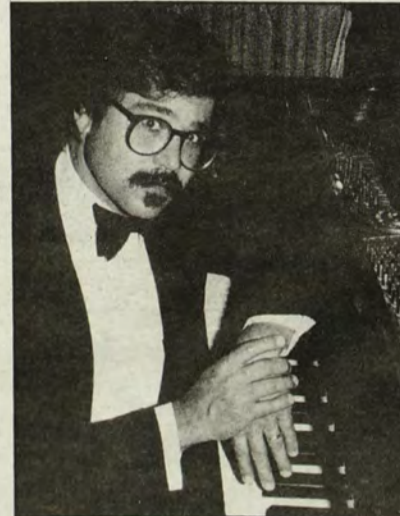

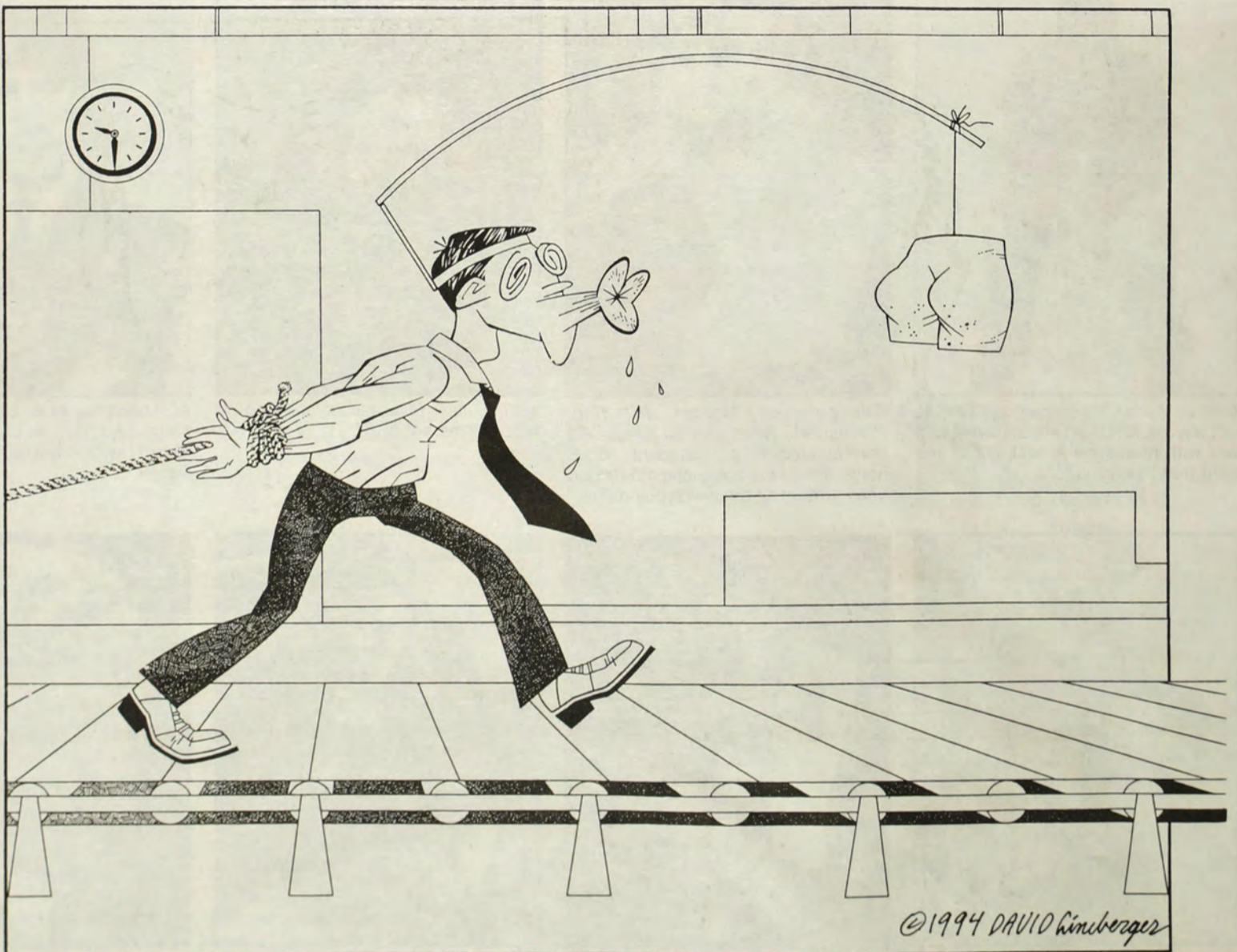

Thursday

My father lived ten years from Shrewsbury, and was in the habit of exchanging visits with Mr. Rowe, and with Mr. Jenkins of Whitechurch (nine miles farther on) according to the custom of Dissenting Ministers in each other's neighborhood. A line of communications is thus established, by which the flame of civil and religious liberty is kept alive, and nourishes its smoldering fire unquenchable, like the fires in the *Agamemnon* of Aeschylus, placed at different stations, that waited for ten long years to announce with their blazing pyramids the destruction of Troy. Coleridge had agreed

to come over and see my father, according to the courtesy of the country, as Mr. Rowe's probable successor; but in the meantime I had gone to hear him preach the Sunday after his arrival. A poet and a philosopher getting up into a Unitarian pulpit to preach the Gospel, was a romance in these degenerate days, a sort of revival of the primitive spirit of Christianity, which was not to be resisted.

It was in January, 1798, that I rose one morning before daylight, to walk ten miles in the mud, and went to hear this celebrated person preach. Never, the longest day I have to live, shall I have such another walk as this cold, raw, comfortless one, in the winter of the year 1798. *Il y a des*

*que ni le tems ni les circonstances peuvent effacer. Dusse-je vivre des siècles entiers, le doux tems de ma jeunesse ne*

*peut renaitre pour moi, ni s'effacer jamais dans ma mémoire.* When I got there, the organ was playing the 100th Psalm, and, when it was done, Mr. Coleridge rose and gave out his text, "And he went up into the mountain to pray, HIMSELF, ALONE." As he gave out this text, his voice "rose like a steam of rich distilled perfumes," and when he came to the two last words, which he pronounced loud, deep, and distinct, it seemed to

me, who was then young, as if the sounds had echoed from the bottom of the human heart, and as if that prayer might have floated in solemn silence through the universe. The idea of St. John came into mind, "one of crying in the wilderness, who had his loins girt about, and whose food was locusts and wild honey." The preacher then launched into his subject, like an eagle dallying with the wind. The sermon was upon peace and war; upon church and state- not their alliance, but their separation-

on the spirit of the world and the spirit of Christianity, not as the same, but as opposed to one another. He

talked of those who had "inscribed the cross of Christ on banners dripping with human gore." He made a poetical and pastoral excursion, - and to show the fatal effects of war, drew a contrast between the simple shepherd boy, driving his team afield, or sitting under the hawthorn, piping to his flock, "as though he should never be old," and the same poor country-lad, crimped, kidnapped, brought into town, made drunk at an ale-house, turned into a wretched drummer-boy, with his hair

sticking on end with powder and pomatum, a long cue at his back, and tricked out in the loathsome finery of the professions of blood.

Such were the notes our once-lov'd poet sung.

## British re-take America United States to become a colony again

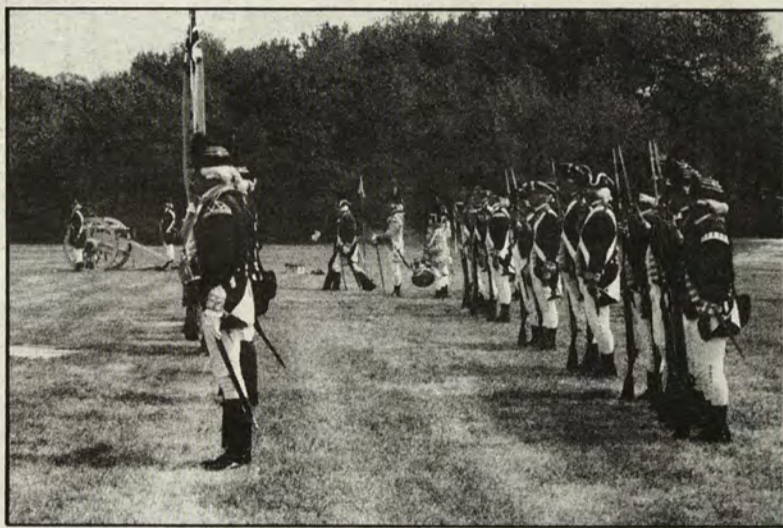

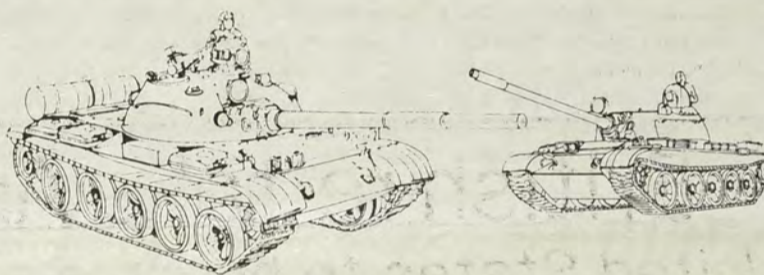

## Rhode Island College being sold to Johnson & Wales

The Canchor staff has learned that Johnson & Wales University is in the process of a hostile takeover of Rhode Island College.

Certain events that have unfolded over the last semester have allowed Providence based JWU to acquire a majority bid on the assets of RIC.

Anchor staff member William Harland has revealed classified correspondence between several high ranking JWU officers that outline the takeover.

The nefarious bid began in September with JWU approaching RIC administration with an offer that would allow JWU to buy a small number of RIC residence hall rooms to house some of their bulging student population. The

deal was cut and the rooms were sold for an undisclosed amount of money.

A Canchor source who works for the bank that cut the check, said the amount was in excess of \$13 million. JWU now owned a small but important piece of RIC.

The next step in their plan took place on the night of November 12, 1993. A small band of JWU burglars perpetrated a Watergate style break in of President Nazarian's office and were able to open the safe and steal several documents pertaining to the fiscal situation of the university.

These documents would later be used to fraudulently place RIC in the hands of the chapter 11 bankruptcy court. The court gave RIC ten working days to rebut the chapter 11 claim, however without

the stolen documents the school's hands were tied, they had to go bankrupt.

The court allowed RIC to be sold at auction for the fair market value, but since JWU owned part of the campus they were allowed to have first chance to buy at a lower price. During spring break JWU offered \$11,000 for all RIC property, buildings, facilities and holdings.

The bid was accepted on March 17, 1994. The title will change hands on April 1.

RIC was denied a withholding order by Judge F.B. Calimari that could have prevented the sale, however in the words of Judge Calimari, "When I attended JWU we had a real sense of pride about the school, now all RIC students will get a chance to feel that same pride."

JWU has announced some minor changes to take place effective the day after the last exam of this semester.

Some of the changes affect the faculty and staff. The workers union in Donavin Dining center will be busted and all workers will abide by JWU worker codes.

The union boss, Jimmy H. Nicholson said, "This will come as a shock to the workers, some of them do not know how to work, the union has allowed them to become so lazy that a little work might kill them." A high executive in the JWU administration said that the workers who fail to make the adjustment from union life to real working life will be replaced by JWU culinary students.

The JWU administration has decided to treat all RIC students as if they were JWU students. The

RIC campus will be called "JWU Eastside", all Eastside students will be required to wear the chefs whites and checkered pants to class.

Eastside students will also be required to take classes on sauteeing and frying chicken. All students will be required to attend regardless of your major.

The buyout will affect others as well. President Nazarian's house will be turned into a fraternity house. They claimed that the nice new circular driveway will make it easier for the fraternity members to load and unload their belongings every time they are thrown off campus.

President Nazarian is planing an extended vacation in Florida. He is going to Disney World. More information will be invented as the story unfolds.

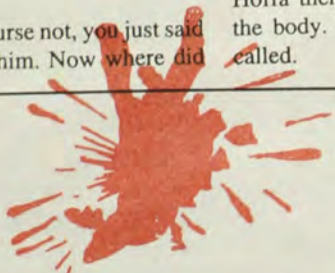


FIGURE 1: Jimmy Hoffa
