With the power of the day.

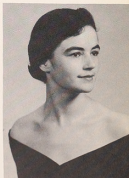
How vain a quest!

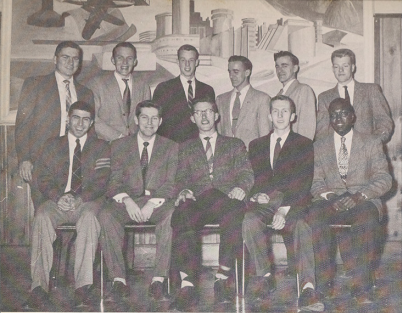
THE NEWMAN CLUB

Touring New Hampshire, Maine, Connecticut, and Massachusetts, the team carried good sportsmanship wherever it played.

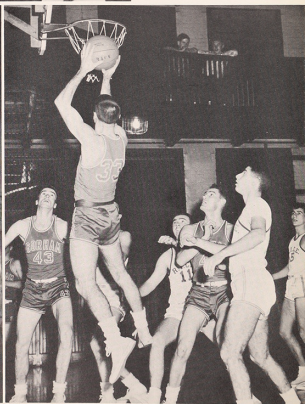
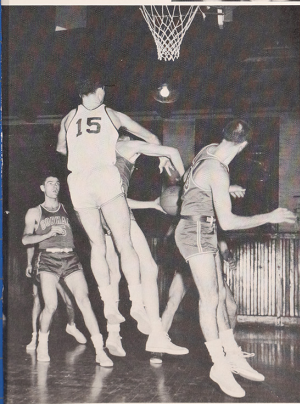
