THE DEL SESTO MACE

At the 1959 Commencement Exercises, the first held on the present Mount Pleasant campus, Governor Christopher Del Sesto presented to Rhode Island College a bronze replica of the statue of the Independent Man so that the College, which up to that time had been located near the State House, might continue its tradition of holding commencements and other academic convocations in the presence of the Independent Man. The Del Sesto Mace, designed by the noted Rhode Island sculptor, the late Aristide Cianfarani, and crafted by the Gorham Company, has been in use since 1962 in all academic processions as symbolic of tradition and authority and, as well, of Rhode Island College's commitment to the search for truth, knowledge, beauty, values, and learning.

THE WILLARD MEDALLION

The Willard Medallion, symbol of the office of the presidency and worn at official and ceremonial occasions, links plates bearing the names of the chief executive officers who have led Rhode Island College since 1973 in a sterling silver collar with enamel medallion. It was commissioned by the Rhode Island College Alumni Association and designed by silversmith Curtis K. LaFollette (professor of art at the College) to commemorate the inauguration of Dr. Charles Borromeo Willard as the first alumnus to be named president of the College. In 1986 Professor LaFollette designed a new sterling silver chain to accompany the medallion.

THE RHODE ISLAND COLLEGE SEAL

The official Rhode Island College seal, adopted in 1960, incorporates the anchor, symbol of hope and of the State of Rhode Island, with the founding date of the institution, 1854, and features the Flame of Life, adapted from the Holbrook Murals in the foyer of Roberts Hall. The flame is used in the murals to depict the energy that has supported over the aeons the development of all living things and has led man to his highest intellectual achievements. In like manner, the flame in the Rhode Island College seal stands for the life of the body and the life of the mind, symbolizing the human and intellectual goals and achievements of Rhode Island College.

ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The caps, gowns, and hoods worn at college and university functions date back to the Middle Ages. Monks and students used them to keep warm in medieval castles and halls of learning. From these practical origins, they have developed into the accepted formal apparel which symbolizes scholarly achievement.

Baccalaureate gowns have a long, pleated front with shirring across the shoulders and back. They are primarily distinguished by flowing sleeves, pointed at the fingertip. These gowns may be worn either open or closed.

The master's degree gown is worn open, and the sleeve is cut so that the forearm comes through a slit just above the elbow.

Mortar boards or caps worn with baccalaureate and master's gowns generally have black tassels. The tassel of the doctoral cap is usually made of gold bullion.

The hood gives color and real meaning to the academic costume. Its silk lining bears the colors of the institution conferring the degree. The hood is bordered with velvet of a prescribed width and color to indicate the field of learning to which the degree pertains.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS



ALEXANDER W. ASTIN

Alexander W. Astin is professor of higher education at the University of California, Los Angeles, and director of the Higher Education Research Institute at UCLA. He has served as director of research for both the American Council on Education and the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. For the past 20 years he has been directing the Cooperative Institutional Research Program, an ongoing national study of some six million students, 50,000 faculty and staff, and 1,200 higher education institutions.

Dr. Astin has authored 16 books and some 200 other publications in the field of higher education. Major areas of inquiry include the outcomes of higher education, institutional quality, equality of opportunity and access, institutional management, and the interface between research and policy. He has been a recipient of awards for outstanding research from the American Personnel and Guidance Association (1965), the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (1976), the American College Personnel Association (1978), the American Educational Research Association (1983), the Association of College Admissions Counselors (1985), and the Council of Independent Colleges (1986); and he has been a fellow at the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences (1967-1968). Recently, readers of *Change* magazine selected Dr. Astin as the person "most admired for creative, insightful thinking" in the field of higher education. His latest book is *Achieving Educational Excellence: A Critical Assessment of Priorities and Practices in Higher Education*.

Dr. Astin has served on numerous boards, such as the American Association for Higher Education, Bell and Howell Education Group, and the Program on Student Potential for College Studies; advisory groups, such as the National Institute of Education Study Group on the Condition of Excellence in Higher Education, the Scientific Advisory Committee of the National Coalition for Research on Women's Education and Development, and the Advisory Committee of the National Project II Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education; and as consultant to groups such as the California Legislature Joint Committee for Review of the Master Plan for Higher Education and the California Postsecondary Education Commission.

Dr. Astin holds an A.B. in music from Gettysburg College, and an M.A. and a Ph.D. in psychology from the University of Maryland, and honorary degrees from Whitman College, Alderson-Broaddus College, and Gettysburg College. He is married to Helen Stavridou Astin. They have two sons, John Alexander and Paul Allen. The Astins make their home in Los Angeles, California.



EILEEN FARRELL

Eileen Farrell, internationally acclaimed soprano, recording artist, and teacher, beloved by the public and highly esteemed by critics, began her career in the early days of radio and since has starred with almost every major opera company and symphony orchestra in the United States. Her extraordinary voice, often described as one of gigantic proportions, has captivated audiences around the world.

Ms. Farrell began her illustrious career as a soloist on leading CBS music programs, and later as the star of her own network program. Her vast radio audience followed her into the concert and recital halls and on into the world of opera in the 50s. Her portrayal of Cherubini's Medea with the San Francisco Opera Company in 1958 established her as one of the great dramatic sopranos of our time. Critics describe her performances as "magnificent," "monumental," "stunning"; her voice "a flawless soprano instrument." Audiences respond to her with shouting, stamping ovations, and at her Metropolitan Opera debut, the ovation she received was, in the words of the *Saturday Review*, "an ear-splitting din." She has been known to give 22 curtain calls.

One of the most notable love affairs on the music scene over the years has been that between Eileen Farrell and the New York Philharmonic. She is on record as the singer who has appeared more often with it than any other. At its gala concert commemorating its 125th Anniversary, she sang the "Ozean" aria from von Weber's opera, *Oberon*. Reporting on what it called her thrilling performance, the *New York Post* said: ". . . when she sounded that first glowing trumpet tone, 'Ozean!', it was like a fiery angel Gabriel proclaiming the millennium."

Ms. Farrell is also known to TV audiences, not only for her operatic performances but for her pop music renditions as well. Filling in for an ailing Louis Armstrong, her appearance at the Spoleto Festival in Europe, which was taped and shown on the Ed Sullivan hour, opened a new dimension in her career. *Time* magazine observed, "To the casual record browser it might signify the most exciting new popular singing talent to come along in years. But the voice is not new. It belongs to the finest dramatic soprano in the United States—Eileen Farrell."

Ms. Farrell was born in Willimantic, Connecticut, spent some of her early years in Rhode Island, and received her first music lessons from her mother, Mrs. Catherine Kennedy Farrell, a singer and church organist. Later she studied in New York with her mother's former teacher. Her solo professional debut came as "the voice of Rosa Ponselle" in a "March of Time" program on radio. In 1947-48 she made her first extended concert tour and since that time has sung an average of sixty concerts a year. Ms. Farrell lives in Yarmouth, Maine. Her son, Robert, Jr., is a lawyer and her daughter, Kathleen, is an M.D.



JOHN NOBLE WILFORD

John Noble Wilford, noted journalist and Pulitzer Prize winner, whose work is recognized and respected by historians, anthropologists, geographers, and other scientists, is a prolific author whose books and articles are enjoyed by the casual reader as well. His work challenges the imagination by spanning both space and time, i.e., *The Mapmakers: The Story of the Great Pioneers of Cartography from Antiquity to the Space Age*, and *The Riddle of the Dinosaur*, to *We Reach the Moon* and *Spaceliner*. *We Reach the Moon*, published in 1969, is the story of the Apollo Project and has been translated into German, Italian, Japanese, and other languages. *Spaceliner*, published in 1981, is the story of the space shuttle project.

Mr. Wilford has had a long and successful association with *The New York Times* where he currently serves as science correspondent. Early in his career with the *Times*, as its science news reporter, he covered all space exploration, and it was through this assignment that he began his work on *We Reach the Moon*. Through the years he has held several positions on the staff of the *Times*, among them director of science news where he was instrumental in the inauguration of *Science Times*, the weekly science section begun in 1978. In his current position as science correspondent, he covers not only space issues, but also the areas of geology, paleontology, archaeology, anthropology, and other related fields.

Mr. Wilford was born in Murray, Kentucky, and attended schools in Tennessee. He received his baccalaureate degree from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville in 1955, a year later earned an M.A. in political science at Syracuse University, and subsequently was designated an International Reporting Fellow at Columbia University. His distinguished career as a reporter began with *The Commercial Appeal* in Memphis, Tennessee, as a general assignment reporter while in college. Upon graduation and with master's degree in hand, he was hired by the *Wall Street Journal* as a general assignment reporter and later as a medical reporter. In 1962 he became a contributing editor for *Time* magazine specializing in science. He moved to *The New York Times* in 1965. His numerous articles have appeared in the *Wilson Quarterly*, *Reader's Digest*, *Saturday Review*, *Science Digest*, *Popular Science Annual*, *New York Times Sunday Magazine*, and others. In 1984 he was the recipient of a Pulitzer Prize for reporting on a wide variety of scientific topics of national importance. In 1986 he accepted WQXR's invitation to become its science commentator on a daily radio feature syndicated to several stations.

A much sought-after speaker, Mr. Wilford has delivered addresses at Yale, Princeton, Syracuse, and the University of Tennessee. He has also served on the advisory committee for "Nova" (the PBS science program) and as a visiting journalist at Duke University. His awards include the Aviation-Space Writers Association Book Award and Writing Award, the National Space Club Press Award, and the AAAS/Westinghouse Science Writing Award.



DAVID ELKIND

David Elkind is currently professor of child study and resident scholar at the Lincoln Filene Center at Tufts University in Medford, Massachusetts. His previous teaching post was at the University of Rochester where he was professor of psychology, psychiatry, and education. Dr. Elkind earned his doctorate at the University of California, Los Angeles, and then spent a year as David Rapaport's research assistant at the Austen Riggs Center in Stockbridge, Massachusetts. In 1964-65 he was named a National Science Foundation senior postdoctoral fellow at Piaget's Institut d'Epistemologie Genetique in Geneva. His research has been in the areas of perceptual, cognitive, and social development, building upon the research and developmental theory of Jean Piaget.

Dr. Elkind's bibliography numbers well over 300 works and includes books, research and theoretical articles, and book chapters. In addition, he has published more popular pieces such as children's stories in *Jack and Jill*, and biographies of famous psychologists in *The New York Times Magazine*, as well as summaries of his own work and approach in publications such as *Parents*, *Psychology Today*, *Parade*, and *Woman's Day*. He is also a contributing editor to *Parents*. His most recent writings include "Early Childhood Education and Formal Education: A Necessary Difference" in *Phi Delta Kappan*, "How Not to be a Pushy Parent" in *Woman's Day*, and "The Impact of Computers on the Mental Development of the Child" in *Computers and Human Behavior*. Perhaps Dr. Elkind is best known for his two most recent books, *The Hurried Child: Growing Up Too Fast Too Soon*, and *All Grown Up and No Place to Go: Teenagers in Crisis*. Forthcoming is a new book entitled *Miseducation: Preschoolers at Risk*.

Dr. Elkind was recently elected president of the National Association for the Education of Young Children. He is a member of many professional organizations and a consultant to state education departments, clinics, and mental health centers, as well as to government agencies and private foundations. He lectures extensively in the United States, Canada, and abroad and has appeared on the "Today Show," the "CBS Morning News," "20/20," "Donahue," and on many cable and local TV programs.

Dr. Elkind and his wife, Nina, reside in Cambridge, Massachusetts.


