

MILLARD D. FULLER

Doctor of Humanities

Millard Dean Fuller, an attorney originally from Lanett, Alabama, has become one of the foremost housing advocates in the world. He is the founder and president of Habitat for Humanity International, which he established together with his wife Linda in 1977. The organization is headquartered in Americus, Georgia. Habitat for Humanity is an ecumenical, grass-roots, interdenominational organization devoted to the elimination of substandard housing for those living in poverty. Today, there are over 1,200 affiliates of Habitat for Humanity throughout the United States and around the world, including four chapters in Rhode Island. The Greater Providence Chapter works with the Rhode Island College Habitat for Humanity, which was officially recognized last December as an official student organization. Habitat volunteers have built homes for over 85,000 families in need in more than 1,500 U.S. cities and 60 other countries, providing decent, affordable shelter for more than 425,000 people worldwide. The organization is now one of the top 20 house builders in the United States and the largest among all nonprofits. From humble beginnings in Alabama, Millard Fuller became a self-made millionaire by the age of 29. A graduate of Auburn University in Auburn, Alabama, and the University of Alabama Law School at Tuscaloosa, he and a college friend began a marketing firm while still in school. Even as his business prospered, however, Fuller's satisfaction with his success declined. Re-evaluating their life together, he and his wife decided to sell all their possessions, give the money to the poor, and begin searching for a new focus. This search led them to Koinonia Farm, a Christian community, where the Fullers initiated a ministry in housing. The concept was to assist low-income families in building their own homes, with the promise that the homeowners would then assist others in building their homes. Modest payments were channeled back into a central fund for the construction of still more homes. In 1973 the Fullers moved to Africa to test this model outside the United States. The project, begun in Zaire, proved successful, and in 1976 the Fullers moved back to the U.S. to found Habitat for Humanity International. Fuller has written six books, including *A Simple, Decent Place to Live*, *The Theology of the Hammer*, *The Excitement is Building* (co-authored with Linda Fuller), *No More Shacks!*, *Love in the Mortar Joints*, and *Bokotola*. He received the Medal of Freedom in 1996, was named Builder of the Year for 1995 by *Professional Builder* magazine, and has received the Martin Luther King, Jr. Humanitarian Award from both the State of Georgia and the King Center. He and his wife are also recipients of the 1994 Harry S. Truman Public Service Award.



BARNABY EVANS

Doctor of Fine Arts

This California native with a background in environmental science and ecology came to Providence in 1972 to attend Brown University, promptly fell in love with the city, and made it his home. While best known as the creator of WaterFire Providence, Evans is also a leading historical preservationist and photographer. He is one of the originators of the Providence Banner Trail. In addition, he was the driving force behind the restoration of the 96-year-old Regent Avenue Elementary School in the Mt. Pleasant section of Providence, which Evans and other artists purchased in 1990 to develop into artists' condominiums and where Evans continues to live and work. *WaterFire Providence*, his best known creation to date, made its debut as a part of First Night 1995 to help celebrate the moving of the rivers in Providence but also, in Evans' mind, as a symbol of the rebirth of his adopted city. Evans developed the piece in such a way that it would bring together the senses of sound, sight, and smell, evoking in each person a different reaction—a reaction which was calculated to change throughout the event as sounds and sights changed. Perhaps for some from Rhode Island College, the flames may even evoke a subliminal association with the flame that is enshrined as a part of the College's official seal. *WaterFire*, which is almost entirely underwritten by private funds, has not only brought the community together by enlivening the city after dark, but has also attracted many business sponsors and helped to promote Providence as a destination city for tourists and business conventions. *The Providence Journal* has hailed *WaterFire* as "the most popular arts event in the city's 361-year history." More recent works by Mr. Evans include *Rikyu's Second Dream*, a 1999 installation at the Rhode Island School of Design Museum, and an upcoming installation entitled *Moving Water*, for the Boston Institute of Contemporary Art's *Vita Brevis* series. Other works by Mr. Evans are in the permanent collections of such museums as the Victoria and Albert Museum in London, the Bibliotheque National in Paris, and the Musée d'art et d'histoire in Switzerland. Evans has received the David E. Sweet Leadership Award from Leadership Rhode Island, the International First Place Programming Award of First Night International, and the Renaissance Award from the City of Providence. Evans was born in Berkeley, California, in 1953 and attended high school in Berkeley and Hawaii. His degree from Brown University is in biology and environmental science.

GORDON M. AMBACH

Doctor of Pedagogy

Gordon M. Ambach is one of our nation's leading experts on federal and state education policymaking. His 44-year career in education includes assignments at local, state, national, and international levels. Beginning in 1967, Ambach served in a leadership capacity with the nation's largest single education system, including a decade of service as New York State commissioner of education and president of the University of the State of New York from 1977-1987. He is credited with developing and implementing the nation's most comprehensive school reform act at that time, the Regents Action Plan, which established the most rigorous diploma standards in the nation. Other major advances were made in serving children and adults with disabilities, establishing a new state library and state museum, promoting accountability in graduate education, and increasing state funding for education. Since 1987, Ambach has served as executive director of the Council of Chief State School Officers. He directs the organization's promotion of federal policy on education reforms, early childhood and family education, learning technology, and improvement of teacher education. He has developed Council services to the states on achieving equity in education, setting standards and assessments for student achievement, strengthening school leadership, and operating the nation's leading partnership to promote arts education in the schools. During the past two decades, Ambach has served as the principal U.S. representative to international organizations concerned with comparative studies of education and the development of international agreements on education goals and practices, most recently in Dakar, Senegal, at the World Forum on Education for All. Ambach is a product of the Providence public schools and a graduate of Hope High School, where he was president of his class, yearbook editor, Rhode Island junior champion in both tennis and badminton, an all-league basketball player, and first cellist in the All-Rhode Island High School Orchestra. He holds a B.A. in American studies from Yale. At Harvard he earned an M.A.T. in history and a Certificate of Advanced Study in education administration. Ambach began his career as a teacher of history and civics at the junior high school level in East Williston, New York, and served as his district's union president and delegate to the New York State Teachers' Association. His career in Washington began in the Eisenhower administration with the U.S. Office of Education. In the early 1960s, he served as Program Planning and Legislative Specialist for the U.S. Education Commissioner in the Kennedy and Johnson administrations during the era when most of the current major federal education acts were developed. Continuing a multi-generational family service in education, Ambach's two sons and daughter teach, or have taught, elementary and secondary school in New York City.



LUTHER H. BLOUNT

Doctor of Commercial Science

Environmentalist, entrepreneur, shipbuilder, inventor, beekeeper, oyster farmer: these are but a few of the hats worn by Luther H. Blount, 83, of Warren, Rhode Island. While his formal education ended with an Associate's degree in mechanical design from the Wentworth Institute of Technology in 1937, his knack for problem solving and workaholic nature have brought him great success. While still in high school, he designed his first boat, a kayak for duck hunters. Later, as an engineering student, he tackled a production problem for his older brother, who had founded the Blount Seafood Company and needed a way to process clams in bulk to fulfill a contract with the Campbell Soup Company. Blount's invention was successful and the company earned a million dollars—a tidy sum back in the 1930's. After serving in World War II, Blount returned to Warren in 1946 to found the Blount Marine Corporation. Blount Marine specialized in building working boats, such as tugs, ferries, short-haul freighters, cable boats, and more recently, dinner boats and coastal cruise ships. To date, his shipyard has completed over 300 vessels. One of his more famous vessels was Miss Liberty, which began ferrying tourists to the Statue of Liberty in 1953. A prolific inventor, Blount currently holds 21 U.S. patents, ranging from innovative marine propulsion systems and hull designs to an effective "pint-a-flush" toilet that has been widely adopted by recreational boaters, thereby helping to protect the quality of fragile coastal environments throughout the world. He also designed and built the first dinner boat in the United States, therein launching an entirely new industry. An adventurer who had long delighted in taking friends on recreational coastal cruises, Blount turned this hobby into a cruise business, which he capitalized on by selling five of his patents for \$50,000 back in the 1960s. This company would later become the American Canadian Caribbean Line and has since become one of the industry's biggest success stories. True to his roots, Blount worked with the Department of Environmental Management in 1979 to distribute four million oysters into Narragansett Bay; in 1999 he founded the Renew the Resources of the Bay Foundation to foster and support development of marine resources in Narragansett Bay. The Blount empire now consists of some 15 corporations. Blount has received numerous awards from technical, environmental, business, and industry groups and is a member of the Rhode Island Heritage Hall of Fame.



EDWARD J. LISTON

Doctor of Public Service

Edward J. Liston is recognized as one of the nation's most influential community college leaders. Since 1978 he has served as president of the Community College of Rhode Island as it evolved from a small traditional junior college into the largest two-year institution of its kind in New England. A son of immigrant Irish parents, Liston is a native of Westchester County, New York, and is a product of public higher education. He holds an M.B.A. from Ball State University in Indiana and a B.S. from the State University of New York, which he attended on the G.I. Bill following military service in Europe. He served as chair of the Division of Business and Economics for Rockland Community College in New York, was the founding president of Housatonic Community College in Connecticut, and served as president of Pierce College in Los Angeles prior to his arrival in Rhode Island. Among his accomplishments: the renaming of the institution (formerly, Rhode Island Junior College) in 1980 which helped to elevate its status while also redefining its mission; the establishment in 1990 of a third major campus in Providence and satellite campuses throughout the state; a major expansion of the Knight Campus in Warwick (underway); and a proposal to establish a permanent campus in Newport (subject to a public referendum in November 2000). Liston gained national attention by developing transfer agreements with some 75 four-year institutions so that CCRI graduates could seamlessly pursue a baccalaureate degree; most of these students choose to attend Rhode Island College and make up a significant and growing segment of our total enrollment. CCRI was also a pioneer in the delivery of telecourses and was cited by PBS in 1989 as the top institution in the country in this regard. CCRI's enrollment of over 30,000 students in a wide variety of degree and non-degree programs is testimony to President Liston's commitment to access and opportunity for nontraditional, underprepared, and part-time students and is emblematic of Liston's commitment to keeping tuition and fees affordable. Liston has also served as chair of the YMCA Tower, Junior Achievement of Rhode Island, the Greater Providence Chamber of Commerce, and is a founding member of the Central Rhode Island Economic Development Corporation. He was twice elected to the Board of Directors of the American Association of Community Colleges, served as chair of the National Council of State Directors of Community Colleges, was secretary/treasurer of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC), and serves on the Board of Visitors of the Community College of the Air Force. President Liston will retire from the presidency of CCRI in June 2000.

THE RHODE ISLAND COLLEGE SEAL

The official Rhode Island College seal, adopted in 1960, incorporates the anchor, a symbol of hope and of the state of Rhode Island, with the founding date of the institution, 1854. The seal was designed by Dr. Edith C. Becker, professor emerita of art, who adapted the central flame symbol from the Holbrook Murals in the foyer of Roberts Hall. The flame is used in the murals to depict the energy that has supported over the eons the development of all living things and has led man to his highest intellectual achievements. In like manner, the flame in the Rhode Island College seal stands for the life of the body and the life of the mind, symbolizing the human and intellectual goals and achievements of Rhode Island College.



THE DEL SESTO MACE

At the 1959 Commencement Exercises, the first held on the present Mount Pleasant campus, Governor Christopher Del Sesto presented to Rhode Island College a bronze replica of the statue of the Independent Man so that the College, which up to that time had been located near the State House, might continue its tradition of holding commencements and other academic convocations in the presence of the Independent Man. The Del Sesto Mace, designed by the noted Rhode Island sculptor Aristide Cianfarani and crafted by the Gorham Company, has been in use since 1962 in all academic processions as a symbol of tradition, authority, and of Rhode Island College's commitment to the search for truth, knowledge, beauty, values, and learning.

THE WILLARD MEDALLION

The Willard Medallion, a symbol of the office of the president worn at official and ceremonial occasions, links plates bearing the names of the chief executive officers, who have led Rhode Island College since 1973, in a sterling silver collar with an enamel medallion. It was commissioned by the Rhode Island College Alumni Association and designed by silversmith Curtis K. LaFollette, professor of art at the College, to commemorate the inauguration of Dr. Charles Borromeo Willard as the first alumnus to be named president of the College.

ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The caps, gowns, and hoods worn at college and university functions date back to the Middle Ages. Monks and students used them to keep warm in medieval castles and halls of learning. From these practical origins, they have developed into the accepted formal apparel which symbolizes scholarly achievement.

Baccalaureate gowns have a long, pleated front with shirring across the shoulders and back. They are primarily distinguished by flowing sleeves, pointed at the fingertip. These gowns may be worn either open or closed.


The master's gown is worn open and the sleeve is cut so that the forearm comes through a slit just above the elbow.

The doctor's gown has rounded sleeves and velvet panels around the neck and down the front of the gown, as well as three velvet bars on the sleeves. In recent years American universities have followed the custom of European institutions of having doctoral gowns in the color of the university.

Mortar boards or caps worn with baccalaureate and master's gowns generally have black tassels. The tassel of the doctoral cap is usually made of gold bullion.

The hood gives color and real meaning to the academic costume. Its silk lining bears the colors of the institution conferring the degree. The hood is bordered with velvet of a prescribed width and color to indicate the field of learning to which the degree pertains.
