The 5 Rs of Open

"Open Education encompasses resources, tools and practices that are free of legal, financial and technical barriers and can be fully used, shared and adapted in the digital environment" - SPARC*

Reuse: Content can be reused in its unaltered form

Retain: Users have the right to make, archive, and "own" copies of the content



Revise: Content can be adapted, adjusted, modified or altered

Remix: The original or revised content can be combined with other content to create something new

Redistribute: Copies of the content can be shared with others in its original, revised or remixed form

Others can copy, distribute, display, perform and remix your work if they credit your name as requested by you



No Derivative Works

Others can only copy, distribute, display or perform verbatim copies of your work





Others can distribute your work only under a license identical to the one you have chosen for your work



Others can copy, distribute, display, perform or remix your work but for non-commercial purposes only.

Student Authorship

"Knowledge consumption and knowledge creation are not separate but parallel processes, as knowledge is co-constructed, contextualized, cumulative, iterative, and recursive." – Robin DeRosa and Rajiv Jhangiani

- Makes Teaching and Learning Visible
- (Re)Imagines "Disposable Assignments"
- Shifts Audience from Individual to Collective

Getting Started

• Sign in with RIC ID (before the @ in your email) and password

Book Creation:

- Create a New Book
- Clone A Book great for revising and remixing!

Adding Co-Authors and Contributors:

- Users must sign in to Pressbooks before you can add them to your book
- Set Roles to allow different users different permissions

Structure & Features

- Book Info
- Traditional book structure: front and back matter, sections, chapters, etc.
- Glossary terms & textboxes
- Media embedding and interactive plugins

Finishing Touches & Publishing

- Appearance/Theme
- Book Cover
- Exporting
