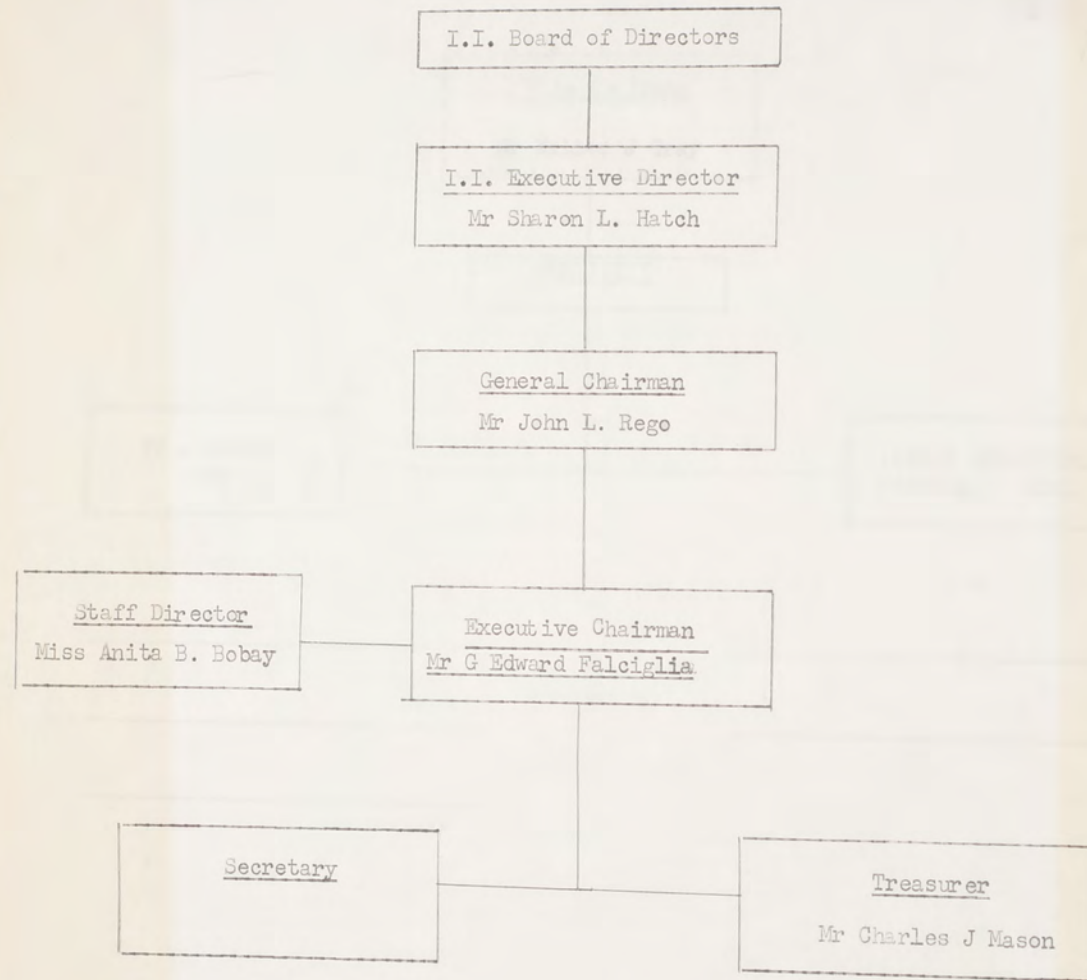

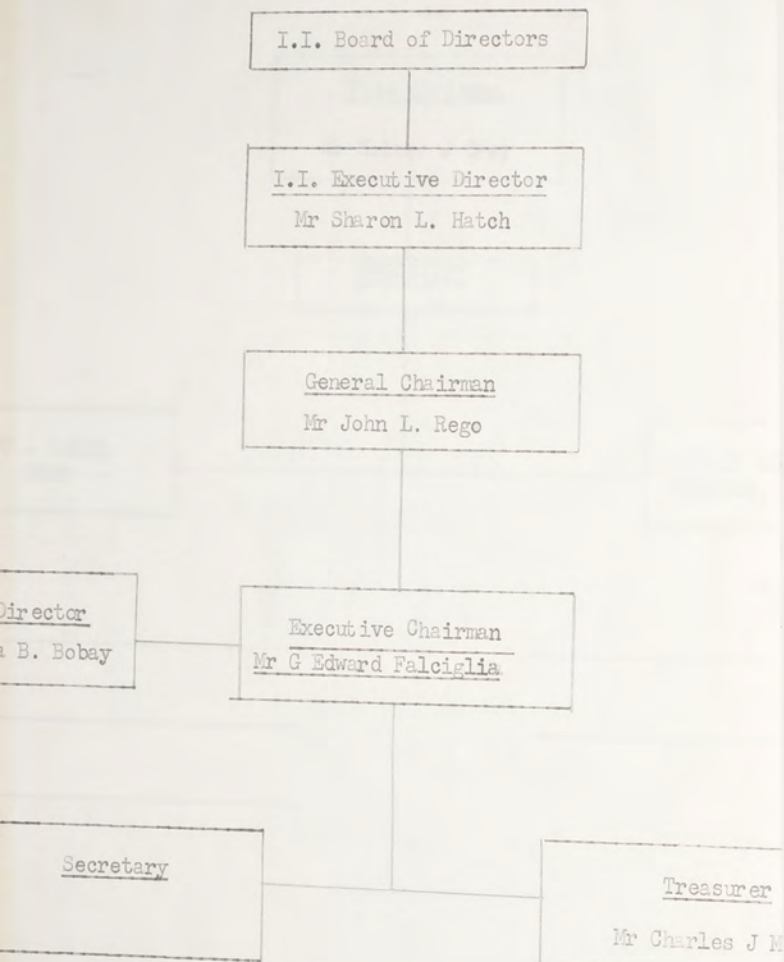

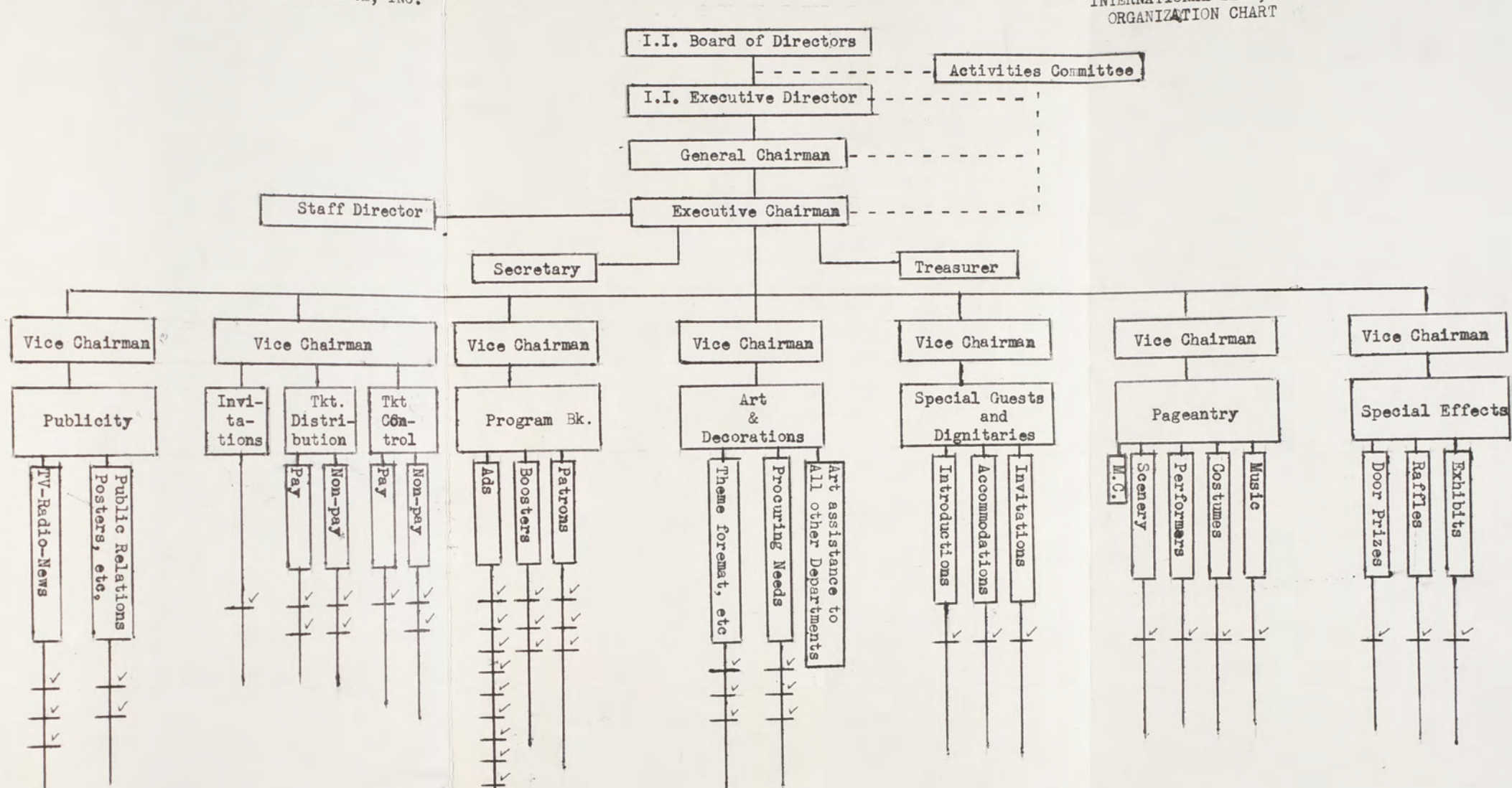
ORGANIZATION CHART

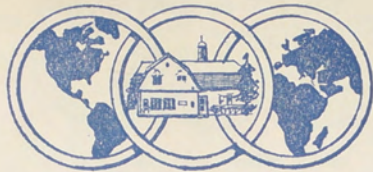


This year we have the assurance from Governor John A. Notte, Jr., that the week of May 7th through May 11th will be proclaimed "International Week."
