Variations of the dance as seen through the eyes of a Japanese dentist and an Indian college student will be featured tomorrow night at the third annual International Ball of the International Institute of Providence, Inc.

Dr. Ryuzo Satoh, a dentist at Rhode Island Hospital, will present an interpretation in dance of an old soldier and an old castle.

Dressed in a red silk petticoat, blouse and sari accented by designs woven in gold thread, Mrs. Uma Rana of Bombay, India, will do a milkmaid folk dance.

Mrs. Rana, a student at Rhode Island College where she is

completing requirements to teach science and mathematics in the United States, is the mother of a year old daughter, Gopi. Her husband, Vasu, is a textile engineer.
