History of Rhode Island College of Education

One hundred years ago this May the State of Rhode Island established Rhode Island Normal School "for the training of teachers of the common schools." This institution was the outgrowth of the teachers' institutes promoted by Henry Barnard, who early advocated the establishment of a normal school; but it was not until May, 1854, that the State Legislature provided that "A sum not exceeding \$3,000 shall annually be appropriated for the establishment and support of a Normal School for the training of teachers of the common schools."

The first home of the Normal School was the building of the Second Universalist Society (on Broad Street, Providence), and Dana P. Colburn, formerly of Bridgewater Normal School, was appointed principal. The new school lacked popular support, however, and in 1857 the State withdrew its appropriation. The Town of Bristol then provided accommodations free of charge and the Normal School remained in that town until 1865. This location proved unsatisfactory, however, because of the distance from the centers of population. The effects of the Civil War, too, caused a gradual decline in enrollment, and the School was finally forced to close its doors in 1865.

During the interim period from 1865 to 1871 the State of Rhode Island continued to educate its teachers at state expense, thus maintaining continuity in the history of state-supported teacher education. Teachers were prepared at various private academies and schools for the six-year period preceding the re-establishment of the Normal School.

In 1869 a vigorous campaign to reorganize the Normal School was undertaken by the Commissioner of the Public Schools, Thomas W. Bicknell, and largely through his efforts the bill establishing Rhode Island Normal School was enacted into law in 1871. High Street Congregational Church housed the School for a few years until it became apparent that larger quarters were necessary. Accordingly, in 1879 the old Providence High School (now the State Department of Education building on Benefit Street) was purchased. There the School remained until 1898 when the new State Normal building, designed especially as a teacher-education institution, opened its doors. On September 7, 1898, speaking at the dedicatory exercises, William A. Harris, then United States Commissioner of Education, said: "If the nation could speak through my voice today, I am sure it would utter its congratulations to the people of Rhode Island on the completion of this, the most finished piece of Normal School architecture in the land."

Prior to the opening of the new building in 1898 three courses were in operation at the Normal School. The Elementary Course paralleled the high school program, since a high school education was not easily attainable for all. The Regular Advanced Normal Training Course was a two-year program of college grade, and the City Training Course was a one-year course instituted by the citizens of Providence and Pawtucket. After the opening of the new Normal School, however, there were increased requirements in the various courses, culminating in 1927 with the lengthening of the required course to four years. The following chronology highlights some important dates in the history of the College:

1908—Required course lengthened to 2½ years. All students must now be high school graduates.

1909—Institution of Saturday classes for teachers.

1913—All candidates for admission required to take entrance examinations.

1918—First summer session for teachers.

1920—Rhode Island College of Education established on April 22, 1920, by Act of General Assembly. Four-year course for degree of Bachelor of Education made optional.

1926—Required course extended from 2½ to 3 years.

1927—Required course extended from 3 to 4 years.

1928—Opening of new building for Henry Barnard School.

1931—Graduation of first full class under four-year requirement.

1939—Retirement of Dr. John L. Alger. Prof. Robert M. Brown named Acting President. In early winter Dr. Lucius A. Whipple appointed President.

1939—Rhode Island College of Education placed under control of newly-created Board of Trustees of State Colleges.

1940—Dr. Clara E. Craig, Director of Training and Dean of the College, retired.

1943—Rhode Island College of Education accredited by American Association of Teachers Colleges.

1951—Dr. Lucius A. Whipple retired in November. Vice-President Frederick J. Donovan named Acting President.

1952—William Clement Gaige appointed President.

In addition to Barnard and Bicknell, there were many other outstanding personalities in the history of Rhode Island College of Education, and no story of the hundred years of the institution's life would be complete without a mention of them. William E. Wilson, teacher from 1884-1892, and principal from 1892-1898, was responsible for the establishment of the first Off-Campus Cooperating School (Benefit and Halsey Streets). The interior plans of the present building were the result of Mr. Wilson's study.

An authority on school law and administration, Dr. Charles Carroll was Professor of Education at Rhode Island Normal School for many years.

Dr. John Lincoln Alger, Principal and President from 1908 to 1939, was a strong advocate of high academic standards.

Dr. Clara E. Craig, responsible for the development of the training school along lines which attracted national and international attention, set and maintained high standards for prospective teachers. Dr. Craig was a teacher at the Training School from 1893-1898 and was Supervisor and Director of Training from 1898-1940. It was she who said "Children must always be allowed to organize themselves in respect to their environment. The function of the educator is only to secure and organize stimuli which make proper call to child responses. Education separated from a condition of freedom is impossible. Freedom, on the other hand, means order and discipline motivated by inherent social instincts rather than compulsion."

During the difficult years from 1941-1951, years which contained a second World War, Dr. Lucius A. Whipple was President of the College. He maintained a lively faith in the purpose of Rhode Island College of Education and in the ability of the students. It was during Dr. Whipple's administration that the College first received national accreditation.

William Clement Gaige assumed the presidency in 1952. His vigorous leadership in the drive for a new college site and plant has resulted in the placing of a bond issue on the ballot in the elections of November, 1954, providing for the relocation of the College.

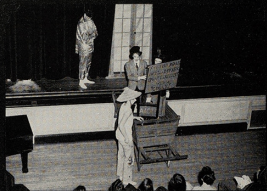

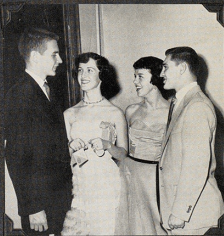
