### History of Rhode Island College of Education

One hundred years ago this May the State of Rhode Island established Rhode Island Normal School "for the tution was the outgrowth of the teachers' institutes promoted by Henry Barnard, who early advocated the establishment of a normal school: but it was not until May. exceeding \$3,000 shall annually be appropriated for the establishment and support of a Normal School for the training of teachers of the common schools."

The first home of the Normal School was the building of the Second Universalist Society (on Broad Street Prov. idence), and Dana P. Colburn, formerly of Bridgewater Normal School, was appointed principal. The new school lacked popular support, however, and in 1857 the State withdrew its appropriation. The Town of Bristol then provided accommodations free of charge and the Normal School remained in that town until 1865. This location from the centers of population. The effects of the Civil War, too, caused a gradual decline in enrollment, and the School was finally forced to close its doors in 1865.

During the interim period from 1865 to 1871 the State of Rhode Island continued to educate its teachers at state expense, thus maintaining continuity in the history of state-supported teacher education. Teachers were prepared at various private academies and schools for the six-year

In 1869 a vigorous campaign to reorganize the Normal School was undertaken by the Commissioner of the Public

efforts the bill establishing Rhode Island Normal School was enacted into law in 1871. High Street Congregational in 1879 the old Providence High School (now the State Department of Education building on Benefit Street) was purchased. There the School remained until 1898 when the new State Normal building, designed especially as a teacher-education institution, opened its doors. On September 7, 1898, speaking at the dedicatory exercises, William A. Harris, then United States Commissioner of Edutoday. Prior to the opening of the new building in 1898 three courses were in operation at the Normal School. The Elementary Course paralleled the high school program, all. The Regular Advanced Normal Training Course was a two-year program of college grade, and the City Training Course was a one-year course instituted by the citizens of Providence and Pawtucket. In addition to Barnard and Bicknell, there were many other outstanding personalities in the history of Rhode Island College of Education, and no story of the hundred a mention of them. William E. An authority on school law and administration, Dr. land Normal School for many years Dr. John Lincoln Alger, Principal and President from 1908 to 1939, was a strong advocate of high academic

Dr. Clara E. Craig, responsible for the development of the training school along lines which attracted national and international attention, set and maintained high standards for prospective teachers. Dr. Craig was a teacher at the Training School from 1893-1898 and was Supervisor and Director of Training from 1898-1940. It was she who said "Children must always be allowed to organize themselves in respect to their environment. The function of the educator is only to secure and organize stimuli which make proper call to child responses. Education separated from a condition of freedom is impossible. Free dom, on the other hand, means order and discipline moti-

During the difficult years from 1941-1951, years which contained a second World War, Dr. Lucius A. Whipple was President of the College. He maintained a lively faith in the purpose of Rhode Island College of Education and administration that the College first received national ac-

William Clement Gaige assumed the presidency in 1952 His vigorous leadership in the drive for a new college site and plant has resulted in the placing of a bond issue on the ballot in the elections of November, 1954, providing for the relocation of the College.



"We would leave for the consideration of those who shall occupy our places, some proof that we hold the blessings transmitted from our fathers, in highest estimation; some proof of a sincere and ardent desire to promote everything which may enlarge the understandings and improve the minds of men.

Advance then, ye future generations! We would hail you as you rise in long succession to fill the places we now fill. We greet your accession to the great heritage which we have enjoyed.

We welcome you to the blessings of good government, and religious liberty. We welcome you to the treasures of science and the delights of learning. We welcome you to the immeasurable blessings of rational existence, and the light of everlasting Truth"
