The fun is not over after Monday because Tuesday is New Music Night. Local bands strut their stuff with music ranging from progressive to heavy metal.

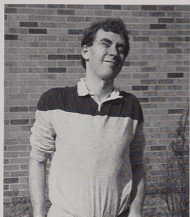


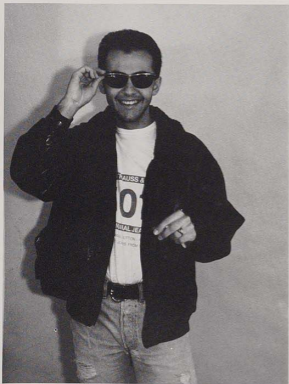

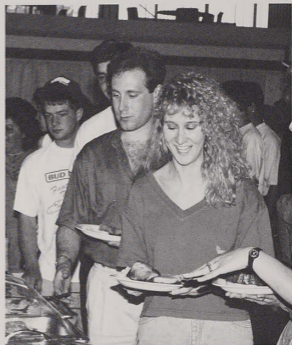
